Combination Analysis Report

1. On 26 February 2008, a husband delivered to SSDI one pair of ladies panties. The item was logged in and testing was completed 2/26/2008. The panties tested positive for semen. See SSDI report PSA81996.
2. As a result of the semen detection, on 2/26/2008 a YPLEX DNA extraction was ordered. The DNA report demonstrated that there was male DNA in the panties of PSA81996 that did not match the husband. See GenQuest report FR200864 (GQ0018836). Upon completion of that test, another DNA test was ordered to separate the male and female cells by a process called differential lysis.
3. We delivered another sample to GenQuest from PSA81996 for the differential lysis on 6 March 2008. The differential lysis produced a clear male and female profile. See report FR2008866 (GQ0018848/GQ0018851). Due to the known fact (FR200864, GQ0018836) that the male from this sample was not the husband, the husband wanted to prove that it was his wife's panties so he obtained a floss pick after her use.
4. On 10 March 2008, GenQuest received the floss pick and produced the R2 profile that proved that the floss pick and the female profile from the PSA81996 panties were identical. See report FR2008866 (GQ0018848/GQ0018851)
5. On 7 April, Private Investigator Steven Tapper delivered to DNA Testing Center one water bottle obtained from Michael Taylor (See chain of custody). The sample was processed on 8 April and GenQuest received the sample for DNA analysis on 9 April. The results proved that the sample from Michael Taylor was identical to the male sperm fraction obtained from the PSA81996 panties. See report FR2008869 (GQCA18891).
6. On 15 April 2008, the husband delivered to SSDI one pair of ladies panties. These panties were marked ~~SSDI~~ *daughter*. This test was ordered to insure the PSA81996 panties were his wife's and not his daughters. See report PSA82052.
7. On 16 April 2008, GenQuest performed A DNA PowerPlex extraction on ~~SSDI~~ *daughter* "SSDI" panties PSA82052. See report FR2008873. This report proved that the female profile from the PSA81996 Panties did not match the female profile from PSA82052 panties.
8. On 17 April 2008 the customer ordered A DNA PowerPlex extraction from his sample proved on 2/26/2008. This profile proved that his PowerPlex profile did not match the male differential lysis profile of sample FR200864 (GQ0018836), and that he is not the father of the panties PSA81996 (FR2008866r1) and that he is the father of ~~SSDI~~ *daughter* panties PSA82052 (FR2008873).

The above statements are true and correct.
